Consider the following exs (Global feminism pgs 842-844; Islamic modernism and revival pgs 884-886; US Civil Rights in the 1960's pg 830; Indian Constitution of 1950 pgs 899-902) *I paragraph answer minimum*
- 8. Post WWII to what degree did popular entertainment culture and consumerism become more global? How did advancing technological capabilities (i.e. TV, internet) help to facilitate this?
